ATVs: A Useful Tool for Hunting

This fall as hunters take to the woods and open fields, you may hear the rumbles of engines. While hunters are cautious to stay quiet and eliminate their scent for fear of

scaring off deer, the ATV or UTV is a useful tool for many and have gained in popularity in recent years.

ATVs and UTVs can help hunters get to more remote locations and have a greater carrying capacity to help haul back an animal when a hunter is successful. Moreover, an ATV/UTV provides an option for hunters with limited mobility to make the trek to their hunting spot and still have an opportunity to enjoy the activity, a tradition for many.

In Wisconsin, groups like the Wisconsin ATV/UTV Association, commonly known as WATVA, have worked to support local initiatives that have provided the state with thousands of miles of dedicated ATV/UTV trails, and even more road routes. There are lots of options for both casual riders and hunters.

Additional \$25 Million Available for Main Street Bounceback Grants

The program provides one-time funding up to \$10,000 for businesses or nonprofits that move into existing vacant commercial properties, helping to create a foundation for long-term success for themselves and their communities. Businesses must apply through the WEDC's [regional partner](#) for their location. Grants are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. The application period closes December 31, 2022.
