Six Ways Partners Created Buzz for Wisconsin Outdoor Recreation in 2025

Before we count down to the New Year, let's toast to partner efforts that put Wisconsin's outdoor recreation offerings and industry in the headlines in 2025. From first-time gatherings to long-time anniversaries and everything in between, partners continued to raise the bar, providing exceptional outdoor experiences, products and services for Wisconsinites and guests.

While meaty, this list is just a smorgasbord of successes we noted in 2025, and with a focus on raising the profile of Wisconsin as an outdoor recreation haven, we're sure it's just an appetizer for what's to come in 2026. Here is a countdown of 6 ways partners put Wisconsin's outdoors on the stage in 2025:

6. Securing Major Events and Introducing Wisconsin to the World

Combined, thousands of competitors and spectators descended on Wisconsin for national and international championship events, while fans near and far followed the coverage.

Transformational infrastructure projects progressed with groundbreaking events and grand openings to ensure exceptional recreation experiences, and events provide a

space for people to connect, learn and celebrate their favorite activities, cultivating lifelong outdoorists.

4. National Designations and Winning Awards

Outdoor brands, organizations and destinations are leading the way, innovating, advocating and volunteering. Awards and designations recognized their achievements.

- Ravin, Mathews Archery and Vortex Optics all win Gold in Bowhunting World's Reader's Choice Awards in 2025 for best crossbow, best compound bow and best spotter and rangefinder.
- Fred Suchy of the St. Germain Bo-Boen Snowmobile Club was awarded the 2025 International Groomer of the Year by the International Snowmobiling Hall of Fame.
- Wisconsin Bike Fed was awarded the Advocacy Organization of the Year by the League of American Cyclists at the National Bike Summit.

While more people than ever before are participating in outdoor recreation and enjoying the benefits of time spent outside, caring for our outdoor assets and making them accessible for recreation and enjoyment isn't new to Wisconsinites – it's a deeply ingrained part of the state's history and culture. Anniversaries celebrated this year marked milestones that reflect Wisconsin's leadership outdoors.

- Wisconsin State Park System 125th Anniversary Travel Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Badgers kicked off the <u>Wonders of Wisconsin NIL (name, image and likeness) campaign</u> with a special <u>anniversary video at Wyalusing State Park</u>.
- Wisconsin Wild Rivers 60th Anniversary In Florence at the Wild Rivers
 Interpretive Center an event celebrated the state <u>Wild Rivers</u> designation to
 "afford people of the state an opportunity to enjoy natural streams, to
 attract out-of-state visitors and assure the well-being of our tourist industry,
 and to preserve some rivers in a free-flowing condition and protect them

- from development," which was created three years prior to the national Wild and Scenic Rivers Act.
- Rails to Trails Conservancy and Elroy-Sparta 60th Anniversary Often considered the nation's first successful rail to trail conversion, the <u>Elroy-Sparta State Trail</u> is featured in the PBS documentary <u>From Rails To Trails</u>, celebrating the 60th anniversary of the national organization and movement to create a network of scenic trails.

NEW Talent Recruitment Grant - Opens soon, Webinar Dec. 2

The program offered by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation opens soon and will provide grants up to \$500,000 per municipality or organization to administer a talent recruitment program. Register to attend the informational webinar on Dec. 2 here.

AARP Community Challenge – Grant Opens in January

Funding will soon be available for projects that focus on meeting the needs of adults aged 50 or older through quick-action grants. Projects may focus on transportation, local improvement projects and more. Applications will be due in March. <u>Learn more</u> about the 2025 grant awardees and sign up to be notified when the application for 2026 opens.

Joint Effort Marketing (JEM) - Grant Applications due February 1

Administered by the Department of Tourism, JEM grants fund events and sales promotion for nonprofit organizations quarterly. In September, multiple outdoor recreation campaigns were awarded JEM grants. You can see awardees here.

MAP: Connecting People to Forests – Applications due January 22

The Matching Awards Program (MAP): Connecting People to Forests focuses primarily on in-person community engagement and completion of appropriate stewardship activities. Programs must create a lasting change that allows all community opportunities to benefit from activities on National Forest System lands or adjacent public lands. Requires a 1:1 nonfederal match.

Ready, Set, Go! (RSG) - Grant Applications due February 1

The RSG program from the Department of Tourism assists destinations in securing competitive sporting events that require a financial commitment to host.

Recreational Trails Program - Grant Applications due March 1*

Administered by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the Recreational Trails Program supports municipal governments and incorporated organizations with reimbursements for the development, rehabilitation and maintenance of recreational trails and trail-related facilities.

*Note that the DNR has proposed moving the application deadline to March 1 (previously May 1). Learn more <u>here</u>.

<u>Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund</u> – Applications due January 15

Administered by the U.S. Department of Transportation, the Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund supports projects that aim to reduce fatal and serious injuries in transportation-related incidents. Eligible projects include transportation safety plans, safety data assessment, improvement and analysis and more.

Vibrant Spaces Grant – FY26 Deadline approaching

The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) provides grants ranging from \$25,000 to \$50,000 to communities for projects that create vibrant and engaging spaces downtown, foster community connection, provide accessible locations for programming and boost foot traffic for businesses. Connect with your Regional Economic Development Director to apply. Communities must have 80% of the funding committed.
